
To Stock or Not Stock the Lake with Fish...... this is the question!

Last year, there was a poll sent out to the lake community in regards to what the Chili Cook-Off donations should be applied towards. The residents spoke, and the majority voted towards stocking the lake with fish. There is no doubt that this would be a Bald Eagle Lake Fisherman's dream and the board has not ruled the idea out. However, there were some concerns raised when the topic was brought to the table and therefore the matter is still being explored.

It has been many years since the lake has been stocked. The question is, why did BELPOA discontinue this practice? Board members from years past have been questioned and it appears the decision was based on a combination of factors. First, there was a fear that bringing in the fish could present new diseases to our established ecosystem, causing unnecessary harm to the existing wildlife. Also, there was an issue with the expense of the project. Stocking the lake with native species of fry was costly. Not only was there an expense, it seemed that the fish that were brought in died off rather quickly. In short, was it worth the money when the fish did not survive anyway?

Since this time, there have been regulations by the DNR regarding fry, so the probability of spreading disease is low. However, the expense of the fish is still high, which leads to the real conundrum. We have raised the funds to stock the lake, but if we allocate those monies to this project, is it a proper use of funds for species of fish that will not survive? At this time, more research needs to be performed. BELPOA knows there is a demand and would like to fulfill the community's request of catching a larger variety of fish. We ask our Fishermen to work with us! Come to the annual meeting and let's dig into the topic further! Help us explore why our private biome cannot support the survival of the fish that once flourished here.

The idea of stocking the lake is not a dead topic. Rather, it is a concept that can be put into action under the right circumstances!



Improving Bald Eagle Lake Health in 2024



IF IT GREENS YOUR LAWN, IT GREENS THE LAKE!

Fertilizers are fabulous for a lush green healthy lawn, but guess what happens when those fertilizers come into contact with algae and lake weeds? That's right, increased population and growth! To reduce the quantity of the aquatic plants that create a nuisance this season, limited to no use of lawn fertilizers would be a big help!

NATURAL LAKE BARRIERS RATHER THAN SEAWALLS

Natural lake barriers have been proven to protect against erosion as well as improve lake quality. The native plants and rocks help filter runoff from the land. This helps to reduce the amount of pollutants that spill over into the water. They also provide a habitat for a greater amount of organisms than other aquatic zones. These habitats are an essential part of the life cycle for many of Michigan's fish and wildlife. The

features of a natural shoreline improve the ecosystem of the lake as well as the quality of water!

So, if you are thinking of making an upgrade to your shoreline, it is encouraged to explore the possibility of including a natural barrier when possible to prevent erosion.

If you need help with your updated shoreline project, The Department of Environment Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) is a great resource. They are always willing to work with the public as they promote environmentally friendly approaches to enhance inland lake health.

INCREASE THE WATER CIRCULATION WHERE WATERS ARE MOST STAGNANT

Areas of the lake that breed excessive amounts of pesky plant life and organic matter are those that are most stagnant. For our lake, these areas are mostly found surrounding the island and/or areas of no wake and throughout the canals.

Fortunately, there are more ways than one that all waterfront property owners can partake in to protect the lake, increase water flow and decrease the growth of unwanted plant life, naturally!

- Pick up your debris! Fallen trees and branches (particularly in the canals), reduce water flow both on a natural level as well as by inhibiting water flow via travel through the waterway. It is extremely important to remove fallen branches and trees from the water.
- Invest in an aerator or blower to increase circulation in areas that are stagnant if possible.
- Rake your leaves in the fall to prevent them from dropping in the lake. Less leaves, less muck!
- Treat high problem areas with natural herbicides BEFORE the growing gets good! Treatment is less effective and will require more applications if performed too late.
- Continued maintenance!
 Unfortunately, maintaining the lake is a job that will never end.
 Luckily, the effort is worth your while!
